MedChi helped form the three ACOs during the past year once positive regulations were released by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. All three ACOs were Advance Payment ACO recipients within the Medicare Shared Savings Program. MedChi Network Services is establishing a shared infrastructure to support secure, real-time data exchange and coordination.

"The ACO program presents us with some exciting opportunities. We will have the incentives and the tools to analyze our patient data in new ways to enhance the care we deliver," says Adam Weinstein, MD, Medical Director of the Eastern Shore ACO. The ACOs and MedChi will continue to serve physicians and patients across the state as this and other programs evolve.
