SUBJECT: Free Speech Applies to Scientific Knowledge

Whereas, The mission of the Maryland State Medical Society is to "serve as Maryland's foremost advocate

Whereas, The definition of science is "The intellectual and practical activity encompassing the systematic study of the structure and behaviour of the physical and natural world through observation and experiment"; and

Whereas, Science has is and continues to be critical in advancing our knowledge in such areas such as medications, vaccines, and climate change and can save lives;²⁻⁴ and

Whereas, The First Amendment of the US is "Congress shall make no law abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press";⁵ and

Whereas, Scientific integrity policies are in place at multiple scientific agencies which were initially put in place via a presidential memorandum instituted in 2009 that states "Political officials should not suppress or alter scientific or technological findings and conclusions" and "If scientific and technological information is developed and used by the Federal Government, it should ordinarily be made available to the public"; and

Whereas, Currently there are no legal consequences for violating these scientific integrity policies;⁷ and

Whereas, Recent policy changes suggest that disseminating scientific knowledge to the public may be impeded⁸ which could have important public, policy, and ethical ramifications; ⁹⁻¹⁰ therefore, be it

Resolved, that the Maryland State Medical Society urge the American Medical Association to work with members of the US Congress and the Trump Administration to assure that scientific knowledge, data, and research will continue to be protected and freely disseminated in accordance with the US First Amendment; and be it further

Resolved, that the Maryland State Medical Society urge the American Medical Association and the Maryland Congressional delegation to pursue all legal means to oppose and nullify any federal policies, orders, laws, or directives that alter or prevent the free dissemination of scientific and technological information and research that is by right and law the property of the American people and to institute legal consequences for violating scientific integrity policies.
