RE:	SUPPORT – Senate Bill 141 – Maryland Medical Assistance Program – Former Foster Care Adolescents – Dental Care

The Maryland State Medical Society (MedChi), which represents more than 8,000 Maryland physicians and their patients, supports Senate Bill 141.

Senate Bill 141 will include dental benefits through age 26 as part of the Medicaid coverage that former foster youth are eligible to receive. Dental benefits are important to the overall health of an individual, and especially important to this vulnerable population as they become self-supporting. Maryland's foster youth are entitled to Medicaid coverage until the age of 26, in line with analogous provisions for dependants under the ACA but dental coverage is only provided through age 21. Expanding coverage to include dental services through age 26 will place these vulnerable youth on par with other individuals their age who are covered by private insurance. MedChi urges a favorable report.

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
