SUBJECT:	Telemedicine and Remote Patient Monitoring - Expanded Use, Coverage, and Payment
Whereas, telemedicine and remote patient monitoring, the combining of telecommunications and information technologies to deliver health care outside of the physician's office, have long been considered a means to improve access to medical care; and	
Whereas, COVID-19 has necessitated an increased use of telemedicine and remote patient monitoring to facilitate physicians helping patients prevent illnesses and in their diagnosis and ongoing treatment of health conditions; and	
Whereas, increased use of telemedicine and remote patient monitoring has heightened issues of concern to physicians, such as insurance coverage, service and payment parity, and patient access; therefore be it	
Resolved, that MedChi, The Maryland State Medical Society, continue to work with our American Medical Association to advocate at the federal level to provide greater access to and payment for telemedicine and remote patient monitoring under federal health programs; and be it further	
Resolved, that MedChi continue to advocate before the Maryland General Assembly and related regulatory agencies to provide greater access to and payment for telemedicine and remote patient monitoring under state health programs.
