The purpose of this grant is to diffuse telehealth in practices statewide with an emphasis on workflow redesign that supports the use of telehealth technology to meet the increased need for virtual patient visits.



To qualify for the grant, a practice cannot have previously billed for telehealth services. Through the guidance of the MSO, a practice will adopt telehealth, complete a satisfaction survey, and receive reimbursement on three telehealth visits. Expected to end on September 30, 2020.

Nonprofit and public eligible healthcare providers are postsecondary educational institutions offering healthcare instruction, teaching hospitals, and medical schools; community health centers or health centers providing healthcare to migrants; local health departments or agencies; not-for-profit hospitals; rural health clinics; skilled nursing facilities; or consortia of healthcare providers consisting of one or more entities falling into the first seven categories.

CAREFIRST/DRFIRST TELEHEALTH GRANT



Physician practices will receive a onetime grant of \$300.00 per physician to pay for one year of DrFirst's Backline telehealth service. <u>Apply here</u>.



Grant program to provide independent physician practices with five or fewer members, a year of complimentary access to DrFirst's Backline Telehealth platform for physicians who enroll between March 1st & December 31st.



The following conditions must be met:

- 1. Medical practice and medical license are in Maryland.
- 2. Medical practice is a private, independent group of five or fewer physicians.
- 3. Practice enrolls in Backline after March 1, 2020 as the result of the COVID-19 crisis.
- 4. MedChi has confirmed the practice's enrollment with DrFirst.
- 5. Enrollment in Backline occurs before **December 31, 2020**.
