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## MEDCHI HOSTS NEW CE INCLUDING IMPORTANT PDMP UPDATES

BALTIMORE – June 17, 2024 – Maryland Department of Health's Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) became operational in late 2014. The program provides healthcare providers with real-time electronic access to patient data. This information helps physicians identify patients at risk and prevent dangerous drug interactions. The PDMP also helps public health and law enforcement agencies reduce the non-medical use, abuse, and diversion of prescription drugs.

A new CE has been developed in collaboration with the PDMP Office to explain the most recent updates in the PDMP, including valuable clinical tools and reports available in the Chesapeake Regional Information System for our Patients (CRISP) Portal.
