RE: **SUPPORT** – Senate Bill 570 – Maryland Medical Assistance Program – Telehealth –

Requirements

On behalf of the Maryland State Medical Society, the Maryland Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, and the Mid-Atlantic Association of Community Health Centers, we submit this letter of **support** for Senate Bill 570 which removes all barriers to the provision of telehealth services under Medicaid.

The General Assembly has recognized that the use of telemedicine services holds great promise for addressing access to care challenges. While the initial focus of its use was on access to specialty care, it has been widely recognized that the full range of health care services can be appropriately provided through telemedicine, including primary care and behavioral health services. Originally referred to as "telemedicine" it more appropriately should be referred to as "telehealth" as reflected in Senate Bill 570.

Historically, there has been a concern that the expansion of the use of telehealth services will increase costs to the program. However, the experience in other states where Medicaid has long reimbursed for telemedicine, and with commercial carriers, has demonstrated that the fiscal impact is minimal and does not account for the savings that could result from increased access to high quality services that are currently unavailable. Passage of Senate Bill 570 will ensure that the full continuum of telehealth services are covered under the Medicaid program. A favorable report is requested.
