Memorial Resolution

MARGIE B. WARRES

Whereas, On January 6, 2019, MedChi, The Maryland State Medical Society, and its component, Baltimore City Medical Society, and their respective Alliances (formerly Auxiliaries) lost a dedicated Past President, Margie B. Warres; at the age of almost 101; and

Whereas, Mrs. Warres, the wife of the late H. Leonard Warres, M.D., a distinguished MedChi/BCMS member of over 60 years, was born on February 17, 1918 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; and

Whereas, She was an alumna of Goucher College, Baltimore, Maryland, and Brooklyn College, New York, from which she received her Bachelors Degree; she received her Masters Degree in Social Work from the University of Pennsylvania; and

Whereas, Mrs. Warres served as Executive Director of the Central Scholarship Bureau of Baltimore, Maryland from 1952 to 1988 and authored the original history of the Bureau, *The Birth and Blossoming of a Bureau: A History of Central Scholarship, 1924-1988*; and

Whereas, She enjoyed a lifetime of volunteer service including, National Chairman of International Health Activities for the Auxiliary to the American Medical Association (AMA); AMA Alliance Delegate; President of the Child Study Association of Maryland; and active member of the Baltimore Hebrew Congregation Sisterhood; among others, and

Whereas, Mrs. Warres, a world traveler, organized the first jet charter to Europe for MedChi members, which became an annual excursion; she served on a number of Alliance committees, in particular, the student aid committee and student loan fund which evolved to the BCMS Scholarship Program, which continues today, annually awarding medical school scholarships; and

Whereas, She was elected to officer positions in both Alliances and was President of the Baltimore City Medical Society Alliance and MedChi Alliance in 1965 and 1968, respectively, and remained active for many years beyond her presidencies; and

Whereas, Mrs. Warres is survived by two sons, Dr. Stephen Warres and Dr. Neil Warres, both psychiatrists, five grandchildren and two great grandchildren; now, therefore be it

Resolved, That the members of Baltimore City Medical Society and MedChi House of Delegates have adopted this Resolution as an indication of the enduring appreciation which Baltimore City Medical Society and MedChi and the Alliance hold for Mrs. Warres; and be it further

Resolved, That this Resolution be spread upon the minutes of this meeting and given to her sons as an expression of the Medical Societies' appreciation for her enduring support and contributions.
