The <u>Maryland Health Care Coalition Against Domestic Violence</u> is in the process of planning several open seminars to be presented this year. May 18th will be the first and will feature the Maryland Network Against Domestic Violence, a seminar on the knowledge and skills necessary to identify and respond to teen dating violence and technology misuse.

Maryland Physician Leadership Institute – the Center continues to partner with Med-Ed Stat LLC. The former Certificate Program in Physician Leadership, now Business of Medicine Pocket MBA Certificate Program is accepting new registrants on a rolling basis. There has been as least 2 to 3 graduates a month. The program is all virtual. We continue to update the program to make it more accessible and cater to the ever-changing needs of the physicians. Other online CME programs being offered are the Tele-mental Health Certificate and Covid-19 Physician Practice Survival Kit.
