GOVERNOR HOGAN ISSUES PROCLAMATION THAT RECOGNIZES HEALTH CARE HEROES THIS THANKSGIVING

BALTIMORE, November 24, 2020 — Last week, MedChi, The Maryland State Medical Society, shared that a resolution was passed at their Fall House of Delegates meeting to recognize the health care heroes who have served, and continue to serve, during the COVID-19 pandemic.
